### FROM THE RECTOR

Dear People of Christ Church,

The Annual Parish Meeting of Christ Church, Georgetown, will be held in the Church on Sunday, February 3, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. At that time, the qualified voters of the parish will elect a Junior Warden for a two-year term and four Vestry members, each to fill three-year terms.

Our parish by-laws define a qualified voter as one who:

1. has attained the age of eighteen;
2. is a stated worshiper in the parish;
3. has been confirmed in this parish or transferred here by letter;
4. and has been entered on the Register of the parish at least one month preceding the day of the parish meeting.

Candidates for office must be qualified voters, as here defined.

The Nominating Committee has recommended candidates for these vacancies in accordance with the by-laws of the parish, and they are identified in this brochure. Other nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Meeting on February 3. The Nominating Committee included the following individuals: Shep Burr (chair), Newman Ainsley, Kathy Carmean, Tim Carrington, Margaret Costan, Billy DeLancey, Keegan Drake, Susan Foster, John Hensley, Kate Lluberis, Richard Riddell, and Jamie Tucker.

Diocesan Canons define the responsibility of the Vestry as follows:

The Wardens and the Vestry shall administer the temporal affairs of the parish, shall elect and call the Rector, shall provide for the regular and well-ordered worship of the Almighty God, and shall cooperate with the Rector in all efforts to develop the spiritual life of the parish.

JUNIOR WARDEN: Russell C. Lindner



A native Washingtonian, Rusty Lindner has been a member of Christ Church, Georgetown, since the mid-1980s. He and his wife, Mimsy, a former Junior Warden of Christ Church, have lived in Georgetown since their marriage. Here they raised their four children: Rebecca, Blake, Mary Faith, and Jones. All four were baptized at Christ Church, and Rebecca was married here in November 2017.

Rusty has served as a member of the Vestry (2005-2007), the Capital Campaign Committee (2001-2003), and the Forward Planning Committee (2017-2018). He and Mimsy are regular attendees at both the 8:00 a.m. Sunday service and the 7:30 a.m. Wednesday service.

Rusty is the Chairman and CEO of The Forge Company, headquartered in Georgetown. Cynthia Efird has attended Christ Church, Georgetown, since moving into the parish in 2011. She and her husband, Neil, are regular communicants at the 11:15 a.m. service and the Wednesday Morning Eucharist. She is a member of the team that officiates at Morning Prayer and is the Christ Church contact for our mission project that supports the Sisters of St. Mary in Malawi.

Cynthia is also a member of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington's Southern

African Partnership Committee, the Diocesan Retreat Committee, and the Angolan Committee headquartered in the Episcopal Diocese of New Hampshire.

A retired U.S. foreign service officer, Cynthia served for 39 years in Central Europe, Russia, and Southern Africa, including as U.S. Ambassador to Angola, political adviser to CYBER Command, and on details to the United Nations in Somalia and Kosovo.

During her overseas tours, Cynthia was an active member (in her private capacity) of local Anglican parishes, serving on vestries, teaching Sunday School, and working with Chaplains of the U.S. Forces and of the Anglican Bishopric of Gibraltar in various capacities. In Angola and Mozambique, she was active in Anglican churches of the Province of Southern Africa, working (again as a private person) on faith-based projects to fight malaria, promote inter-communal reconciliation, and build churches. Previously, she was a long-time member of St. Paul's Church, K Street, where she was a member of the Vestry.
